Enhancing Mundy Creek begins...

Residents of Belgian Gardens and Rowes Bay have recently formed the Mundy Creekwatch Group. Their first tree planting along the creek was on World Wetlands Day in February 2005 and now they have planted another 60 plants as part of World Environment Day in June. Thanks to Townsville City Council, photos from the first tree planting day are on the newly developed website. Combining a litter collection with the tree planting ensures this creek will continue to be rehabilitated. Along with the tree



planting efforts, the group has also been talking with Council about the potential future upgrades of the existing bikeway between Garbutt and Rowes Bay. This upgrade will ensure the many users of the bikeway will benefit from the new track for many years.

The group's next event is National Tree Day on Saturday 30th July. Everyone is welcome for another great morning. Meet along Mundy Creek next to the Rowes Bay Caravan Park between 8:30am - 11:00am.

Creek to Coral is coordinating the Rowes Bay "Learnscape" Project (funded by Department of Primary Industries and Fisheries (DPI&F) as part of a fish habitat mitigation project) to develop a Learnscape Facility between Rowes Bay beachfront and Kissing Point. The project components agreed to, in conjunction with DPI&F and Queensland Parks & Wildlife Service (QPWS), include: \$5,000 for Seagrass Watch monitoring in Cleveland Bay; \$5,000 for Reef Check monitoring and reporting on health of Cleveland Bay fringing coral reefs. This will include developing interpretation and school talks (Townsville/Thuringowa); and \$20,000 for a "Learnscape" viewing platform at Rowes Bay to highlight marine values of Cleveland Bay, to promote appreciation and make available to school functions. Design iterations for the "Learnscape" boardwalk are currently being undertaken and will be finalised in July 2005. Gilianne Brodie of James Cook University (JCU) is to contribute ecological and biological information on the uniqueness of the area.
