
Community Planting in Heatley

Join the Community Environment Fund and Greening Townsville for a community tree planting in your neighbourhood.

In this project, Townsville City Council are supporting local residents in continuing their native planting efforts, as well as conducting further rehabilitation along the creek, which is a tributary of Louisa Creek. Volunteers have already conducted weed clearing activities and a small planting earlier this year.

Everyone is welcome to participate in this community planting. All site preparation (including hole digging) will be carried out by Townsville City Council staff prior to the event. Activities on the day will include tree planting, fertilising, mulching and watering.

Community Environment Fund

The Community Environment Fund is a three-year project funded by a \$500,000 community grant from Powerlink Queensland, and \$500,000 from project partners the Townsville City Council and Thuringowa City Council.

The Fund aims to form partnerships and undertake projects that enhance the environmental properties of the Townsville and Thuringowa region, and to minimise the visual impact on the community of the electricity infrastructure owned, operated and maintained by Powerlink Queensland.
